





In the Menu Bar section, select a colour for the Menu Bar BG and the Menu Bar hover BG




The Pages are added to the new Custom Menu, select Save Menu




To change the order of the Pages in the Custom Menu, click and drag the Page bars to a new position Select Save Menu




To add the new Custom Menu to the Theme, select it from the drop down menu in the Primary Navigation Theme Locations section




The Custom Menu is now the Primary Menu




To create another Custom menu, select the plus sign, enter a name for the menu








Edit image settings



- Add the following to the image text fields:
- Title The title of the image
- Alternative Text Text that is shown when the image is highlighted or not visible
- Caption Small text label that appears below the image
- **Description** Describes the image, useful for SEO and Screen Reading software for Visual Impaired Users
- Link URL Directs the User to another page or file when they click on the image
- **Alignment** positions the image on the page
- Size resize the image
- Insert into Post Adds the image to the page
